Treaty #3 Leadership meet with IJC Commissioners

August 15, 2019 in Treaty 2
Territory, Leadership from the
Anishinaabe Nation of Treaty #3
and technical support staff met with
International Joint Commission
(IJC) Commissioners and staff at
Prairie Firehouse in Brandon, MB.

The meeting was attended by Canadian Commissioners Beland, Lickers and Phare as well from the US Commissioners Corwin, Sisson and Yohe. Treaty #3 leadership included Grand Chief Francis Kavanuagh (GCT3), Chief Brian Perrualt (Couchiching), Chief Tom Johnson (Seine River) and proxy for Grand Chief Jerry Daniels (SCO) Tina Keeper.

The meeting was a result of continued work by both Grand Council Treaty #3 and the IJC in order to ratify a formal relationship together recognizing the jurisdiction of the Anishinaabe Government as well the role of the IJC in the protection of boundary waters and how the two can work together in order to protect Nibi.
